It has been a great start to term 5 with lots going on right from the start. We have had our first round of GCSE Art and Photography exams, our French speaking exams as



Congratulations to Jamie in year 8 who was awarded a Merit in his grade 1 euphonium music exam




We also watched a science show and saw some exciting demonstrations including a giant glow stick!

Cantonese preserves more features of Acient Chinese than do the other major Chinese languages; its various dialects retain most of the final consonants of the older languages and have at least 9 tones








#### **STELLAR DINER MENUS**
