MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL



We are now only days away from the end of this first full term of the academic year and the Christmas holidays are just a few days away.

It has been a very busy term with lots of brilliant opportunities for the students here at Nova. We aim to continue this over the next two terms with a number of exciting trips and visits being currently planned by staff for the Easter and Summer terms. 


FRIDAY CHALLENGE

RAF CAREERS VISIT

Sgt Dingle from the RAF careers engagement team came in to speak to year 8 about opportunities in the RAF. From apprenticeships to graduate entry, students learnt about the recruitment journey, basic training and officer, aircrew selection and roles available including engineering, aircrew, cyberspace, intelligence, logistics, legal and medical services.



Sgt Dingle outlined the pay and benefits including pension, lifelong learning, subsidised food and accommodation, sports facilities and adventurous training. This was a highly interactive session and Sgt Dingle was impressed with the behaviour, attentiveness, questions and answers from our year 8 students.

OTTERS AND DINOSAURS AT THE MUSEUM

The Science department trip to the Oxford Museum of Natural History gave Year 9 scholars the opportunity to engage in educational talks by professors from Oxford University, learning how life on Earth has changed over millions of years. After hearing these inspirational research lectures, scholars explored the museum's huge collection of fossils, skeletal recreations and geological wonders. Scholars showed exceptional understanding of many of the exhibits and were

successful at completing a scholastic treasure hunt while discovering the museum.

The first lecture by Claire Marr gave a fantastic insight into conservation work and biodiversity investigations being conducted in the Amazon rainforest. We learnt a lot about apex predators, including jaguars,



ocelots and giant otters! Later, palaeontologist, Stephanie Lechki explained how palaeontologists reveal and explore the secret world of dinosaurs with traditional and advanced scientific methods.

The students were a credit to the school.
