MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Year 11 in particular have come back and made a very strong start to their final mock exams working exceptionally hard throughout this first week of mocks. On this same note we have been seriously impressed by the numbers of Year 11 students over the past few weeks staying to continue working in our optional **Champions Hour** from 4–5pm.

We had a **review & support visit** this week from our trust United Learning which has highlighted lots of areas of good practice across the school and some areas of focus to continue to work on. Feedback from all of the visiting Headteachers was that the students who they spoke with throughout the day were very polite, well mannered and articulate and were an absolute credit to the school.

A big area of focus for us this term is **literacy**, particularly tutor time reading.

As you will know students at Nova spent three tutor time periods a week reading a book together. We do this because we know that there is a strong correlation between language development and students' future success, we believe that spending time reading together with an adult modelling excellent reading is one of the most important things we can do as a school to ensure students are successful. It is for this same reason that we set Sparx Reader for homework at Key Stage Three, we want to maximise the opportunities that students have for reading. We really appreciate all the support from parents in ensuring that both Sparx Maths and Sparx Reader are completed for students on time each week. A reminder that if students need support with this we have homework support club running 3–4pm Tuesday to Thursday in the library.

It has been great to hold our third annual **Iftar** this week and welcome members of the community to this event. The event was a great success. As we look towards the end of this term we look forward to celebrating and recognising Easter.

YEAR 10 EXPERIENCE LIVE ONLINE INTERVIEWS

National Interview Month provided us with an opportunity to work with **Your Game Plan** so that 80 Year 10 students could have a 1-2-1 virtual interview for 30 minutes with an industry professional.

These professionals were matched with students following a pre-interview questionnaire that the students filled out, thus giving them a chance to question and be questioned by an interviewer in a field, or associated field, to their current chosen career field. Many employers are currently using




online interviews as an initial way to make their shortlists for face to face interviews so this was an invaluable experience for our students to gain experience of what it is like to be interviewed virtually.

HPV IMMUNISATIONS

The HPV vaccine is offered to all boys and girls in Year 8 (aged 12/13 years) because the evidence is clear that the HPV vaccine helps protect both boys and girls from HPV-related cancers. More than 280 million doses of the HPV vaccine have been given worldwide, including 120 million doses in the US and over 10 million in the UK.

The HPV vaccine used in the NHS vaccination schedule is Gardasil 9 and protects against 9 of the types of HPV



which can cause cancer and genital warts for most people with just one dose.

YEAR 9 HISTORY WORKSHOP
