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and understanding they have acquired during their time at Nova. Whether this is breaking down and solving complex problems in maths, making astute economic observations in business or analysing and interpreting influential texts in english, these exams allow our Year 11s to demonstrate what they are capable of in a broad range of important subjects.

Starting the 2nd week back after half term, our next round of Best in Everyone assessments (BiE 2) are due to start for our Year 7 – 10 scholars. These assessments provide our most accurate understanding of what has been learned throughout the year, and more importantly provides teachers with essential information on what to revise, reteach or stretch during the rest of the year. The final timetables for these assessments are currently being finalised, so please look out for a full schedule soon. In the meantime, students are encouraged to start revision for these as soon as possible. Subject teachers will provide additional information on how to revise, but as a great starting point, any online learning platforms such as Sparx make an excellent revision resource. In the majority of subjects, assessments will include all the content covered this year, as well as elements of the curriculum covered in any previous years.

It is also an exciting time for our year 9 scholars, who have found out their GCSE options this week. Students were able to choose 4 out of a total of 16 different options to study alongside their core subjects, providing a huge range of different experiences. At Nova, we pride ourselves on offering a broad curriculum, allowing students to take subjects they may never have studied before (such as Computer Science, Photography or Health & Social Care), as well as being able to study their existing favourite subjects (such as French, Art or Geography) to a higher depth. The GCSE option process is the first time students are able to have substantial control over what they learn, and helps each of our scholars tailor their academic lives to meet their interests, talents and skills. We have an exceptional cohort of students at Nova, and this tailoring of learning is an excellent way to help us best cater to each and every one of them.

As we move into our final half-term, there are many different things to be excited about. For our year 11s, we'll be having our End of Year celebrations to recognise the end of their time at Nova. They will also have their Summer Ball, marking an important passage between their school life and adult life. For the rest of the school, in addition to the important exams already discussed, term 6 brings the exciting and competitive Sports Day, as well as many other fun and engaging competitions, trips and events.

I want to finish by wishing all our Nova scholars the very best for each of their upcoming exams. Keep up your revision, keep working hard and you will attain a set of results to be proud of, opening up the doors you need for the exciting futures ahead of you.



# Bengali

#### FACTS:

Bengali language, member of the Indo-Aryan group of the Indo-Iranian branch of the Indo-European language family. It is spoken by more than 210 million people as a first or second language, with some 100 million Bengali speakers in Bangladesh; about 85 million in India, primarily in the states of West Bengal, Assam, and Tripura; and sizable immigrant communities in the United Kingdom, the United States, and the Middle East

## Bengali is the state language of Bangladesh and one of the languages officially recognized in the constitution of India. Here are some examples:

English	Bengali
How are you?	তুমি কেমল আছ? Tumi kēmon ācho
Be careful	সাবধাৰ Sābadhān
And	এবং Ēbang
But	কিন্দু Kintu
Help me	আমাকে সাহায্য করো Āmākē sāhāyya karō

- Script: The Bangla script, called "Bangla Lipi" or "Bangla Script," is an abugida, meaning each consonant character carries an inherent vowel sound that can be modified with diacritics. It was developed from the Brahmi script and has undergone various changes over the centuries.
- 2. Literary Tradition: Bangla has a rich literary heritage dating back to the 9th century. Renowned poets, writers, and scholars have contributed significantly to Bangla literature, making it one of the most vibrant and diverse literary traditions in the world.
- 3. Rabindranath Tagore: Although primarily known as a poet, Tagore's literary repertoire includes several novels. While he didn't win any specific awards for his novels, he was awarded the Nobel Prize in Literature in 1913 for his overall contribution to literature, which includes his novels like "Gora," "Ghare-Baire" (The Home and the World), and "Chokher Bali" (A Grain of Sand).

The school atmosphere was overwhelmingly positive the whole day, thank you to all who made this a success.






















#### LATEST NEWS FROM DRAMA



# FREE School MEALS

### Why apply?

- Registering for free school meals will bring more money to school to help your children to achieve.
- We have spent funding we receive on small group sessions to boost reading, additional after-school support lessons for scholars studying for their GCSEs, ELSA support sessions (for scholars that need help with managing emotions) to name a few!
- In Years 10 and 11, scholars eligible for free school meals receive a 30% discount on school trips. We may be able to extend this to Years 7-9 with additional funding.

Content Agency

- Registering for free school meals is confidential, your child's peers will not know that they applied, and you only need apply once.
- Taking up the meal is recommended but optional. So picky eaters don't have to eat the meal.
- Free school meals represent a £49 saving per month, per child.
- Eligible scholars in Year 11 have received revision guides that they can take away and use at home on a long-term loan worth £30 and an exam pencil case with pens and pencils worth £8.
- Nova has a great diner, with a good variety of nutritious food and is rated excellent by the Food Standards Agency.

Please check your eligibility by scanning the QR code, more money for the school means we can continue to improve your children's education.
