SPORTS NEWS





YEAR 8 TRIP TO SILVERSTONE

The Science Department organised a trip to Silverstone Museum for year 8. We enjoyed a tour of the main exhibition, which incorporates the history of Silverstone itself and the history of motorsport, where we were able to get close to genuine raced vehicles and clothing. It was fascinating to learn about all the different careers in the motorsport industry, including medical support, mechanics, safety and a visit to the Tech Lab with the technology and engineering itself.

On the Heritage Track Trail, scholars were able to walk on a section of the original Silverstone Circuit, offering them a great view of some areas of the current circuit, discovering about the history of the track, the prestigious races that have taken and those that continue to take place.




SUMMER CONCERT
