MOREDON PRIMARY STUDENTS EXPLORE THE HUMANITIES AT NOVA HREOD

Year 5 Students from Moredon Primary School visited Nova Hreod Academy for a captivating Humanities workshop filled with discovery, engagement, and enthusiastic participation. The young explorers delved into the world of geography and map-reading. Led by Nova's passionate geography teacher, Miss Waters, the students learned about grid systems and map references. Armed with pencils and maps, they deciphered coordinates to interpret maps accurately.

In another session, the students explored the wonders of the Hindu Festival of Holi with Mrs Bekir and Miss Taylor. They learned about legends such as the tale of the evil king Hiranyakashipu who plotted to kill his own son for choosing to honour Lord Vishnu instead of his own father, and about the Festival of Holi, a joyous Hindu celebration that marks the arrival of spring. The Year 5s listened attentively and answered questions enthusiastically. Mrs Bekir praised the students.


